HOW TO GET TO SAINT-MARTIN

All airports are fully operational, with approximately 60 flights weekly across 12 different commercial airlines. Princess Juliana International airport (PJIAE) has daily nonstop service from Miami and JFK airports in mainland US. Additional nonstop flights are operating from other Caribbean islands.

CRUISES/ YACHTING

Since November 2017, **Crystal Cruises** is homeporting from the Port of Galisbay in Marigot offering a 7 day cruise to the neighboring islands. Since the arrival of Crystal Esprit the Port has welcomed 582 passengers. In 2018, the Port of Galisbay is expecting 42 cruise calls carrying 4 500 passengers.

In 2017, the port welcomed 1 624 passengers.

So far, it is more than 70,000 passengers who made a stopover to the island.

Sunsail and The Moorings, have reopened yacht operations on the island with a fleet of 30 boats (multihulls).

The brands' new charter base location is at Marina Fort-Louis, which will house a diverse fleet of monohulls, sailing catamarans and powerboats.

Marina Fort-Louis is fully-equipped with amenities including water, electricity, fuel, WiFi, provisioning, shower and laundry facilities.

The new Marigot Bay location offers convenient access to shops and restaurants along the waterfront and in the city center.
